registered in Denmark, together equivalent to about 7% of all vehicles in the country. As of August 2022, 19.1% of all new cars sold in Denmark were fully electric, and 18.0% were plug-in hybrid. In 2022, Denmark was ranked by Forbes as the third most EV-friendly country in the world.
